Randy Gariss is a well-known name in the Illinois Campus Ministry circle. He is a life-long pastor, counselor, and spiritual mentor. Every third year, Encounter ISU, one of our Illinois sister ministries invites Randy to reframe our students' concept of what love, marriage, and a relationship with Christ can look like. He covers topics ranging from spiritual wholeness to understanding pornography addictions to emotional maturity. One of the passages that he preaches on during the weekend is 2 Thessalonians 5:23-24, "23 Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. 24 He who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it." Notice two things; Paul's prayer is for our whole being to be kept blameless, to be completely sanctified, and second that it is God, the faithful one, who will do it. The call on our lives is to surrender completely every aspect of who we are: emotions, relationships, aspirations, desires and aspirations both good and bad (and everything else). Yet we often try to hold back parts of who we are from the transforming grace of God's Spirit out of fear or shame or pride or ignorance or just plain selfishness. Worse, we often try to fill up what we know is lacking in ourselves with others. We use people and activities that we enjoy to feel better and "completed" while avoiding the real changes God has called us to. We were made to participate in the very life of God. Randy draws this out beautifully in his messages on wholeness in Christ alone and emotional maturity. His messages, as they do every year, hit home in really hard, really good ways. In our small groups we had students breaking down as Randy helped open their eyes, not to the brokenness in their lives, because they already knew it was there, but to why that brokenness was so pervasive. We were made with an instinct to love and be loved, but the ability to truly love and be loved only comes from a relationship with the God who made us to be like Him, in His image. Randy's messages about wholeness and right concepts and living in wisdom fit our Wednesday night series like a glove.

On Wednesday nights we have been doing a topical study of spiritual formation. We have called it the regula series with the intention that students would understand that we don't accidentally grow closer to God, we intentionally structure our lives to submit to His will. As Randy's version of Matthew 6:21 goes, "Where your investment is, there your heart will be also." As we study things like prayer, fasting,

guidance, worship, study, and other habits that we can cultivate in our lives this semester, our prayer is that students would learn to invest in the faithful God, knowing that it is the faithful God who gives the transformation, but also knowing that theirs is a call to seek Him, obey Him, to know Him and to love Him. May God grant you all peace as you pray for us and our students. We look forward to seeing you all on April 22nd to share what God has done this year!
